As most of you know, AIA Vermont's web site opened up in early December. For anyone who has not tried it out, I would recommend a visit. We have a very complete Events calendar and our Job Bank has already had four listings. We have already started changing to accommodate user's requests.

Our Job Bank has expanded to allow listings of architectural items for sale. The site design allows a lot of flexibility in what is displayed. At this point, I am updating the site almost daily, so the best information sent to AIA Vermont will show up quickly on aiavt.org.

Another reason to visit is to check that the contact information we have for you is correct. Since I requested firm listing information seven months ago, a great deal has changed on the site. We now offer fax numbers with Roster and Firm listings as well as listings to individual Members, Associates and Professional Affiliates as you can see on the Member Resources/Member Roster page. Note that only Firms and Professional Affiliates show up on the Public page. So far we have only two member listings, but that is probably because no one knows we have the other options. This page could be useful for contacting other members, etc. Let me know if you want other listings or changes thru the Feedback link. Please note that this site has been designed with email links hidden from the automated web spiders that can collect addresses for spam. 

Example 1 For any spontaneous react (*large S = large disorder*). For any **spontaneous** reaction, the entropy of the Universe must increase (2nd Law of Thermodynamics). For a reversible reaction the change in the entropy is given by q_{rev}/T where q_{rev} is the heat absorbed by the system and T is the absolute temperature. Units of S are J K⁻¹ mol⁻¹
