The 75-Year Awards

In honor of AIA Vermont's 75th Anniversary in 2023, we are pleased to announce the 75-Year Award competition. The 75-Year Award will recognize buildings of architectural significance completed over the last 75 years in the state of Vermont. The 75-Year Award seeks to celebrate Vermont's architectural history, from 1948 through to today.

Schedule:

9/12: Call for Entries Opens for the 75-Year Awards

10/20: Deadline to submit to the 75-Year Awards via email

10/30: (week of) 75-Year Award Jury Review by Jurors as listed below.

11/10: Winners will be notified

12/7: AIAVT Annual Meeting and Design Awards event: Winners will be announced at HULA lakeside in Burlington, VT and later displayed on AIAVT website.

What can be submitted: Any architect-designed building finished in 1948 or later, (built in the last 75 years) that is located in the state of Vermont. This can also include historic preservation projects, additions, and/ or renovations.

Who can submit: Open to the public.

Fee: There is no fee to submit to the 75-Year Awards

Submission Materials: At least one image, maximum of 20 images, text (200 words max), on the significance of the building, and why this project is deserving of the 75-year award.

Jury: A separate jury from the Annual Design Awards jury will review and select the winners of the 75-Year Awards. The number of winning projects will be at the discretion of the Jury.

- Building name being submitted
- Building architect or designer's name
- Building address
- Date built
- Text (200 words max) on why this project is deserving of the 75-year award (please attach as a pdf).
- Attach at least one image (up to 20 images maximum), please include photographer's name. AIAVT reserves the right to reproduce images submitted in digital and print media.
