

Co-Founder & Executive Director LeaderFlow Janiece Williams is the Co-Founder and Executive Director of LeaderFlow, a nonprofit dedicated to empowering diverse midcareer professionals through its annual leadership development program. LeaderFlow addresses a critical gap in the architecture, engineering, and construction (AEC) career pipeline, where diverse leadership remains significantly underrepresented and retention challenges continue to persist. Trained as an architectural designer and a graduate of LeaderFlow's pilot cohort, Janiece is deeply committed to supporting emerging professionals as they navigate and advance within the AEC industry. She recognized the transformative power of prioritizing personal growth to cultivate a new generation of impactful and inclusive leaders in the field.

Janiece has been actively involved in the National Organization of Minority Architects (NOMA) serving on the Southern California Chapter's Executive Board from 2018 to 2021. During her tenure, she was a planning committee member and mentor for the annual Project Pipeline Architecture & Engineering Summer Camp for middle and high school students. She was also instrumental in launching the SoCal NOMA Diversity Equity and inclusion Challenge in 2020, the first structured DEI initiative in the architecture industry, aimed at addressing the longstanding lack of diverse representation.

She believes that attracting and retaining top talent requires fostering inclusive work environments, promoting diverse career pathways, and investing in comprehensive personal and professional development at all career stages. LeaderFlow currently operates in Los Angeles, Seattle, Houston, New York, and Chicago, with plans for continued national expansion.
