About Norwich University:

Norwich University is in the beautiful Green Mountains of Vermont, only 20 minutes from the state capital, Montpelier, and three hours from Boston and Montreal. Founded in 1819, Norwich University is the oldest private military college in the country and the birthplace of the Reserve Officers' Training Corps (ROTC). Today we are a diversified academic institution that offers undergraduate and graduate degrees and professional certificates to adult learners online and to Corps and civilian lifestyle students on campus.

Job Description:

The School of Architecture + Art (SoA+A) at Norwich University invites applications for a tenure-track Assistant Professor of Architecture. We are a small, collegial faculty dedicated to edifying “citizen architects” and reinforcing the university’s commitment to “service before self”. We foster an ethos of climate responsibility, and design as social action throughout the curriculum. Our students and faculty benefit from interdisciplinary opportunities within the College of Professional Schools, including the nationally recognized Center for Global Resilience and Security, and the Design + Build Collaborative, which addresses the needs of Vermont communities and includes the design and construction of affordable housing. Our place-based culture of experiential learning is rooted in rural Vermont and broadened by CityLAB:Berlin, a satellite campus of Norwich University in Germany. The College also includes schools of Business; Cybersecurity, Data Science, and Computing; Engineering; and Nursing.

The preferred applicant will have primary expertise in building-systems design and integration with the ability to teach courses in subjects like materials and methods, active building systems, and project delivery. They will have demonstrated excellence in design and an interest in design

education. Responsibilities include teaching technical courses, design studios, advising graduate thesis students, mentoring undergraduate students, and university service. Professional development including research or other creative achievement is expected, and resources are available to support these endeavors.

Requirements:

The preferred candidate must have a terminal degree in architecture or a related discipline, specific expertise in building-systems design and integration, strong communication skills, full- or part-time teaching experience as a primary instructor at the university level and a strong commitment to scholarship and advising. Additionally, the school seeks individuals who have literacy and experience with contemporary digital design and fabrication tools, an interest in design build, and a desire to play an active role in the day-to-day life and evolution of the school's program and design culture.
